

“Providing emergency telecommunications services to the humanitarian community”

ETC Situation Report #19

Republic of South Sudan

Reporting period 28/02/13 to 04/04/13

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Highlights:

- Following an assessment in Maban, the ETC Working Group agreed to dismantle the ETC Emergency Response Solution now the humanitarian organizations operating there have their own connectivity solution in place. The one-day training sessions on radio use have begun and will continue to take place through April.

Cluster Responsibilities:

- WFP is leading ETC activities in RoSS with responsibility for coordination, implementation, and overall operational support for common ICT services.

Achievements:

- Maban Assessment - The ETC team visited all NGOs in Maban (RI, ARC, RCS, Medair, IMC, Handicap, GOAL, SP, Mercy Corp, NPA, ACTED, Solidarities, CAFOD, MSF, DRC, LWF). The organizations had inadequate internet connectivity for long term sustainable operations. ETC supported the Maban refugee response for the last 14 months until all organizations had their own connectivity. The result of this assessment showed there will be no negative impact on the operation with the withdrawal of the ETC Emergency Response Solution. Consequently, the equipment was dismantled and refurbished to be ready for another emergency.
- ETC has begun the one-day training sessions on radio usage. There are four modules: Training of Trainers, Radio Operator, Driver, and Humanitarian Staff to take place in the field and Juba.
- ETC presented the new strategy to the ISWG that will be adopted for the second half of the year.
- LUX visited South Sudan to support the deployment of the ETC as well as to deliver a training session to humanitarian organizations on how to deploy the emergency.lu Rapid Deployment Kit. Gilles Hoffmann delivered a one-day training to eight ICT staff from seven different organizations, including REDR-UK, Plan International, UNOPS, UNOCHA, Oxfam, UNFPA and WFP.
- An ICT Officer has been deployed to Yida to move the ETC Emergency Response Solution indoor unit to a location where the device is better protected from heat and dust.

Challenges and Gaps:

- Importation of telecommunications equipment continues to be a concern as significant delays are experienced in receiving tax exemption letters and customs clearance.

Planned Activities:

- The "Introduction to IT Emergency Management" course will take place in Juba on 03 – 05 April.
- The HISP implementation is planned to start on 01/04/2013. HISP will be established primarily in the following state capitals: Aweil, Wau, Malakal, Bentiu, and Bor.
- Based on the feedback received from the NGO Forum information and the humanitarian organizations wanting to benefit from the HISP, ETC will conduct a site survey to identify suitable locations.
- There will be an assessment mission undertaken in Jonglei State in response to the current on-going emergency. The ETC Coordinator will be in Bor from 08 April to 10 April to assess potential common operational needs.

Meetings:

The Global ETC Teleconferences on RoSS will be held on an ad hoc basis. Operational updates continue to be shared via monthly ETC SitReps. Local ETC Working Group meetings are scheduled for the first Thursday of each month at 11am (UTC +3) in Juba.
