ETC Situation Report #20

Republic of South Sudan

Reporting period 31/03/13 to 30/04/13

Highlights:

- Following an assessment in Jonglei State, the ETC Coordinator advised the ETC Working Group that Pibor will soon become a common coordination hub for the Jonglei crisis.

Cluster Responsibilities:

- WFP is leading ETC activities in RoSS with responsibility for coordination, implementation, and overall operational support for common ICT services.

Achievements:

- The ETC Coordinator went to Bor, Jonglei State, to conduct a telecommunications needs assessment. The mission was also supposed to include an assessment in Pibor but due to the ambush of the UN military convoy on the road from Gumruk to Bor on 9 April 2013, it was cancelled. UN and NGO staff who work in Bor and Pibor were interviewed about their needs in the area. The following items were identified:
 - Majority of staff stay at the UNMISS compound; the remaining humanitarian workers stay at INTERSOS.
 - INTERSOS has a VSAT that runs on solar power which only provides enough connectivity for ten people at a time.
 - The roads will soon be inaccessible due to the rainy season.
 - There is currently only one generator in the INTERSOS compound.
 - Fuel is difficult to get to Pibor.
 - UN movement on the Bor/Pibor road has been suspended until further notice due to 9 April 2013 incident on that road.
- ETC has begun the one-day training sessions on radio usage in the state capitals. There are four modules: Training of Trainers, Radio Operator, Driver, and Humanitarian Staff.
- The ETC Coordinator presented the new strategy to the ETC Working Group and all members endorsed the strategy.
- The “Introduction to IT Emergency Management” course took place in Juba on the 03 – 05 April with 15 IT professionals graduation from the course.
- The ETC team presented the new ETC strategy to the MoTPS and received verbal acceptance of the proposed way forward.

Challenges and Gaps:

- Importation of telecommunications equipment continues to be a concern as significant delays are experienced in receiving tax exemption letters and customs clearance.
- Rains have been reported to have started already in the Equitorias and Jonglei. The road situation will quickly change in the coming weeks if the rain continues.
- The situation around Pibor remains tense and unpredictable. The incident on 9 April 2013 affects the movement of food and other humanitarian supplies into Gumruk and Pibor. All UN movement on the Bor/Pibor road has been suspended until further advise.

Planned Activities:

- The HISP implementation has been delayed to June. HISP will be established primarily in Aweil, Wau, Malakal, Bentiu, and Bor.
- Response kits - As the rainy season is quickly approaching, the ETC Working Group decided to keep the Regular Kit in Maban for the anticipated refugee response and repair the RAPID kit for Pibor response.
- During the second half of the year, LetsComm training will be held again for IT technicians. This training is teaching staff on how to install and maintain radios systems. Two slots for this training will be reserved for colleagues within MoTPS.
- ETC and partners are exploring different options on the best approach to switch from analog to digital radios over the next five years.

Meetings:

The Global ETC Teleconferences on RoSS will be held on an ad hoc basis. Operational updates continue to be shared via monthly ETC SitReps. Local ETC Working Group meetings are scheduled for the first Thursday of each month at 11am (UTC +3) in Juba.
