1. Update on the latest ETS activities in north-east Nigeria

Security Situation

• Violent incidents in the northeast and banditry in the northwest continue to be major factors that contribute to instability within Nigeria.

ETS Services

- The ETS provides security communications, internet connectivity, ICT helpdesk, service for communities, Information Management (IM), and coordination services to humanitarian responders.
- The ETS provides security communications services in Damaturu, and Yola metropolitan areas. Internet and security communications services are delivered in the eight humanitarian hubs in Borno State—Bama, Banki, Damasak, Dikwa, Gwoza, Maiduguri, Monguno, and Ngala.
- The ETS is available to provide user and security communications training on demand.

ETS activities in April

- In April, the ETS provided internet services in eight common operational areas to 1,020 users from 103 organisations (15 UN agencies and 88 INGOs) and resolved 876 issues logged by the ICT helpdesk.
- ETS Nigeria programmed nine radios for UN agencies and INGOs in April to enhance staff safety through reliable and update communications services.
- The ETS provided Very High Frequency (VHF) radio services to 68 organizations—16 for UN agencies and 52 for NGOs in April.

2. Partner Updates

International Rescue Committee (IRC)

 ETS partner—IRC—enquired about a notice of registration and regulation of VHF radios that was issued out by the local authority to organisations using the VHF radios in Maiduguri metropolis. Due to this notice, IRC decided to uninstall the radios previously installed in their mobile vehicles.



- The ETS explained that they did not receive such notice of registration and regulation. The sector further explained that partners would only receive such notices if on importation of the VHF radios the partner did not submit them for verification and authourization to the National Communications Commission (NCC).
- Furthermore, the sector requested from partners that received similar notice to forward the details to Nigeria.ETS@wfp.org for further investigation.

Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO)

- FAO has new staff that resumed recently at their Maiduguri field office. FAO requested for ETS support in reprogramming old radios and programming of newly acquired radios to support the new staff to ensure their safety and security while working in the field.
- The ETS requested FAO to send a request via <u>Nigeria.ETS@wfp.org</u> for follow up.

World Food Programme (WFP)

- WFP appreciates ETS support as regards to the complaint of 'out of range' notification reported by the WFP team whenever they are using the VHF radios in Maiduguri. Now, WFP can use the VHF radios without the error notification coming up.
- The ETS explained that they received similar complaints from some users before and the issue was resolved after the radios were reprogrammed to the new code plugs. The sector is monitoring the new code plugs and documenting reports for the new code plugs to be troubleshooted and issues resolved.

3. AOB

 The ETS is planning to improve its engagement and support to partners in the northeast by including new topics, short training sessions on VHF radio, and exploring new ideas for services for communities. The sector requested partners to send ideas on how to improve the Local Working Group engagements via <u>Nigeria.ETS@wfp.org</u>.
