ESTABLISHED ON 03 JULY 2024 BUT NOT ACTIVATED

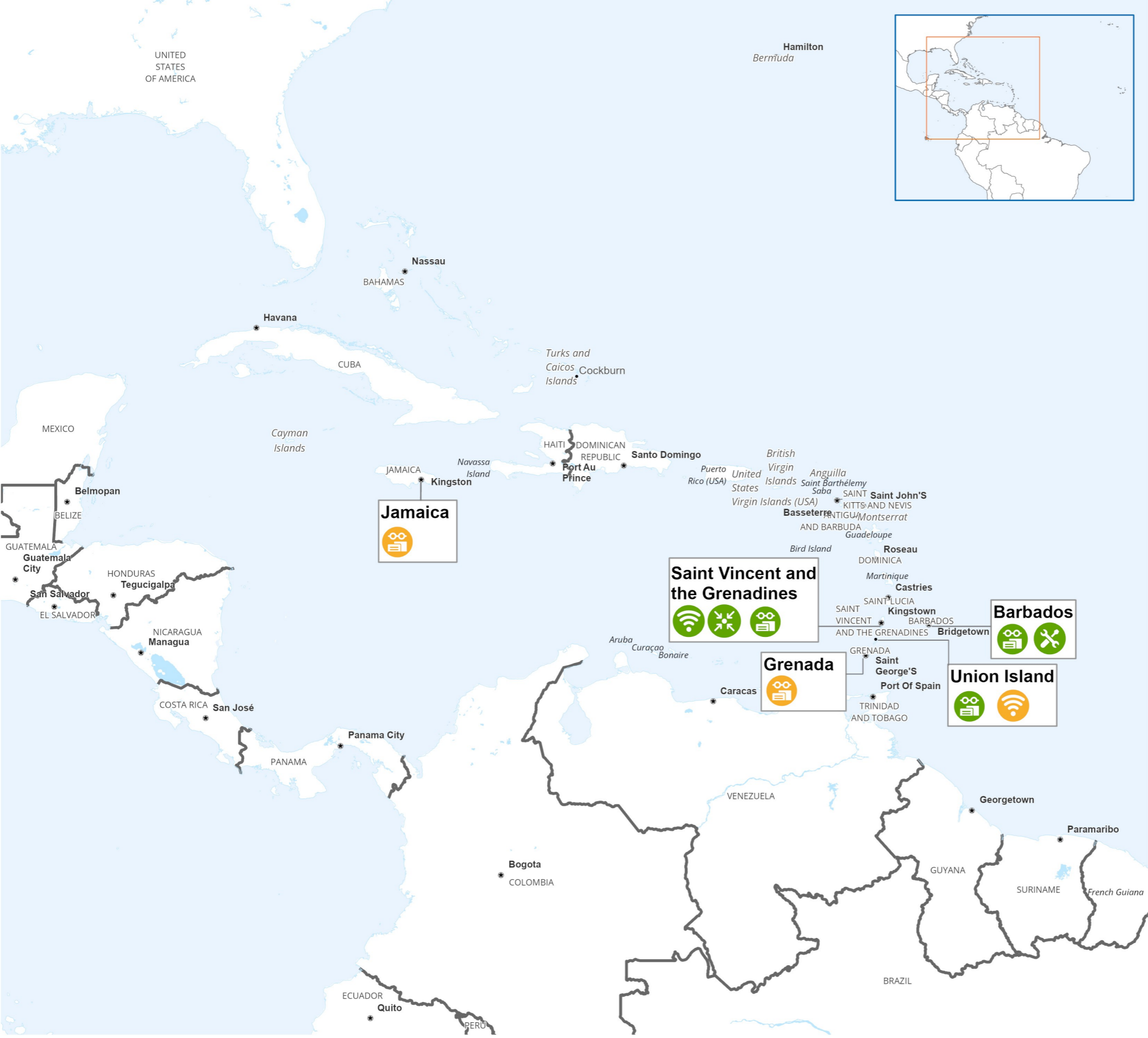
*Hurricane Beryl—the strongest hurricane in the history of the Atlantic in the month of June—formed on 30 June as a Category-4 hurricane and swept across the Caribbean, impacting multiple island nations. The Caribbean Disaster Emergency Management Agency (CDEMA) is leading coordinated efforts, supported by National Emergency Management Coordinators, for the response which commenced with initial rapid needs assessments on 02 July. The ETC is not activated but coordinating with its partners globally and on the ground to assess and respond to ICT needs, through CDEMA.*
