

Nigeria – Crisis

ETS Situation Report #44

Reporting period 01/06/2020 to 30/06/2020

As global lead of the Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC), the World Food Programme (WFP) is convening the Emergency Telecommunications Sector (ETS) in Nigeria, responding with government, private sector and humanitarian partners on the ground to ensure a coordinated response. ETS Nigeria SitReps are issued monthly.

Highlights

- The ETS continues to provide data connectivity and security communications services to the response community in 10 sites. Since the beginning of the year, the team has provided Internet connectivity to more than 3,327 users from 101 organizations across North-East Nigeria.
- Throughout June, the ETS programmed 13 radios for humanitarian responders to improve the communication between staff in the region and to ensure their safety and security.
- This month, the ETS conducted four webinar sessions on security communications for 32 humanitarians in Gwoza and Monguno.

ETS Activities

- Since the beginning of the year, the ETS has provided Internet connectivity services to more than 3,327 users from 101 organizations (15 United Nations agencies and 86 non-governmental organizations/NGOs) across North-East Nigeria. In addition, 118 issues reported to the helpdesk were resolved in June.
- This month, the ETS conducted four webinar sessions on basic VHF radio use for 32 participants from the Alliance for Medical Action (ALIMA) and International Rescue Committee (IRC) in Gwoza and Monguno.
- Throughout the month, the ETS programmed 13 radios for staff of humanitarian organizations to improve the communication between staff in the region.
- ETS Nigeria held its monthly Local Working Group meeting on 24 June to discuss partner updates and identify evolving needs of humanitarians in the field locations.



Planned Activities

- The team will commence the installation of the hybrid solar-based power system when COVID-19 travel restrictions are eased. The much-anticipated project is aimed to provide a more reliable and sustainable power supply for humanitarians who currently rely on fossil-fueled generators.

Challenges

- The ETS has postponed activities, including field missions and physical training sessions due to travel restrictions to curb the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic in North-East Nigeria. The restrictions on field travel will directly impact the set Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) of ETS activities for the year.
- The outbreak has also led to delays in staff recruitment and deployment.

Funding

- The ETS is 59.3% funded of the total US\$2.95 million required to carry out its projects in 2020.

Meetings

- The next Global ETC Joint Teleconference covering Bangladesh, Central African Republic, Libya, Nigeria, Syria and Yemen operations will be held on 29 July 2020.
- The next Local ETS Working Group meeting will be held on 22 July 2020.
