Minutes

1. Situation update

- Gaziantep residents were seen coming back into parts of the city.
- Humanitarian agencies are setting up temporary operational base camps in Gaziantep.

2. Emergency telecommunications updates in Turkiye

- A TEC emergency coordinator arrived in Gaziantep on 12 February to initiate interagency ICT coordination as well as needs assessments for the interagency humanitarian community in support of the national response efforts.
- The cluster system has not been activated at this stage in Türkiye.
- Besides supporting affected populations, there is a common advisory agreed at the Security Management Team (SMT) level to temporary move UN staff to safe locations.
- The TEC emergency coordinator in collaboration with partner humanitarian agencies have assessed and identify the gaps for intervention in the affected areas, especially in strengthening common services.
- While voice and data connectivity from national service providers is functional, agency teams undertaking field visits are also carrying back-up communications equipment such as satellite phones. Locations facing fluctuating network connectivity are Reyhanli and Antakya.
- There are also power challenges in parts of Hatay and Kahramanmaraş provinces. Most Mobile Network Operators (MNOs) in these provinces are running on generator power.
 The situation is being monitored.
- WFP, as the global lead agency for emergency telecommunications, has mobilized resources to support the initial interagency response through deployment of key staff members responsible for security communications and coordination.
- UNDSS is leading and managing the field safety and security of all interagency staff from Ankara and Gaziantep. With the expected surge in the number of humanitarian staff, UNDSS will also require additional staff and supporting equipment, which is



currently stretched. Security communications training will be coordinated under the Inter Agency Telecommunication Working Group (IATWG). The WFP telecom specialist mobilized to support the security communications, will also be expected to provide users training on radio communications.

- The TEC emergency coordinator is moving to establish the IATWG. The IATWG will invite all humanitarian actors, including UN agencies and International Non-Governmental Organisations (INGOs), to exchange information and resources, and plan for a coordinated response to the Türkiye-Syria earthquake. The ICT IAWG will operate under guidance of Terms of Reference (ToRs) currently being developed. WFP will take the lead in coordination of the IATWG. The first IATWG is tentatively scheduled for 16 February.
- Omar Namaoui was officially mobilized from Ankara on 14 February to support the Türkiye response as ICT intergency coordinator. He is traveling to Gaziantep on 15 February.

3. ETC Syria updates

Syria


- Data connectivity and security communications services remain operational in the interagency hubs in Homs, Aleppo, and Qamishli with stable ETC connectivity services backed by generators and solar power systems.
- An ICT officer from the WFP Syria Country Office (CO) deployed for one month on 13
 February to support the Syria field offices based on the Türkiye side of the border. He
 will be based in Mersin, Turkiye as of 14 February. The staff member is trained in VHF
 radio, security communications, and VSAT connectivity services.

4. Partner updates

International Telecommunication Union (ITU)

- The Disaster Connectivity Map (DCM) for Türkiye and Syria has been active since 6
 February. The earthquake resulted in a fall of mobile data connectivity to 80% of the
 normal status.
- ITU insights show an improvement in spatial spread of restored connectivity in the earthquake affected regions of Türkiye and Syria. By 11 February, 3G data connectivity had been restored to 90% of normal (green and white dots).





Pockets of connectivity loss are still evident (red dots).

NetHope

- The NetHope teams are operating in collaboration with a local partner and are present in Kahramanmaraş and Hatay provinces.
- Electricity shortages and fluctuating mobile data connectivity services are being experienced in Kahramanmaraş and Hatay provinces. The fuel supply is improving.

Télécoms Sans Frontières (TSF)

- TSF teams deployed in Kahramanmaraş and Hatay provinces continue to support UNDAC and Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) teams. The teams arrived on the ground on 10 February.
- Voice calls and 4G data connectivity was restored in Hatay and Malatya a few days after the earthquake.



- Local telecommunications operators are working with Türkiye's Disaster and Emergency Management Authority (AFAD) to restore connectivity in all the affected areas.
 Approximately 200 mobile base stations have been installed in the provinces of Kahramanmaraş and Hatay to compensate for unusable base stations destroyed during the earthquake disaster.
- According to information on the ground, urban search and rescue missions are nearing completion.
- Approximately 3,500 power generators were deployed for both Kahramanmaraş and Hatay provinces to alleviate power challenges. A fuel supply is available.

UNHCR

Türkiye

• The Head of ICT from UNHCR Türkiye visited the Urfa and Hatay offices after 10 February. In Urfa, voice calls, data connectivity, and satellite phone connections are all functional. There is no electricity power in Hatay, as infrastructure was destroyed during the earthquake. The quality and connection of voice calls is poor, especially in the city centre. Satellite phone connection is functional.

Government of Luxembourg¹

• The Government of Luxembourg team on the ground in Türkiye installed a Ground Air Transmit Receive (GATR) VSAT terminal at the Belgian Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT) site to support the response in Kırıkhan, Hatay province. This is in addition to the Ku-Band VSAT installed at the Sub- On-Site Operations Coordination Centre (OSOCC) in Hatay. Another Ku-band VSAT terminal is planned to be shipped on 15 February to replace the GATR.
