The Emergency Telecommunications Sector (ETS) is co-led by WFP and the Government of Türkiye's Ministry of Transport and Infrastructure. The ETS is supporting the government-led response in the areas impacted by the multiple earthquakes which struck on 6 February 2023. The ETS is coordinating to support data connectivity services in common spaces, strengthen security communications, and support the provision of charging stations for affected communities in temporary settlements.
